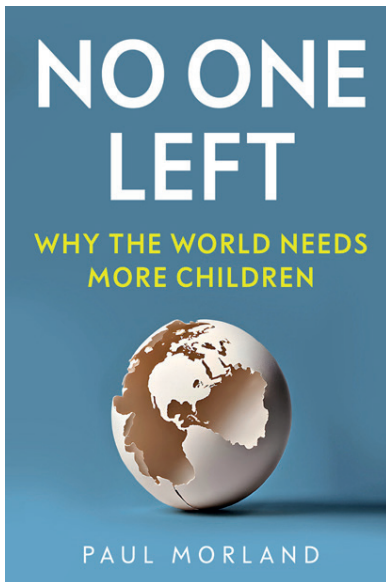

Before the end of the current century at the latest, and probably much sooner, the world's population will start to decline.

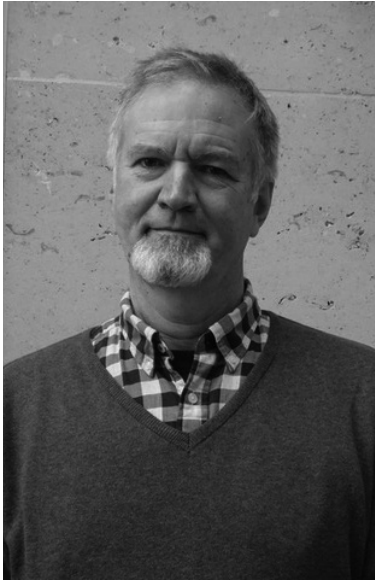
Leading demographer Paul Morland argues that the consequences will be calamitous. Labour shortages, pensions crisis and ballooning debt threatens to engulf us all, and sooner than we think. In time an increasing number of elderly people will simply be left to their own devices as there will not be enough people of working age to meet all needs.

No One Left charts this future, explains its causes and suggests what might be done. Unless we radically change our attitudes towards parenthood and embrace a new progressive pronatalism, we face disaster, argues Morland. We can and must rise to this challenge.

Paul Morland is one of the world's leading demographers. He has been an Associate Research Fellow at Birkbeck, University of London and a Senior Member at St Antony's College, University of Oxford. His previous books include *The Human Tide: How Population Shaped the Modern World* and *Tomorrow's People: The Future of Humanity in Ten Numbers*.

Family life has changed rapidly over the past 60 years. Increased opportunities for women, greater freedom and autonomy, and a more equal domestic sphere have brought considerable benefits. However, argues Goodhart, there have been losses as well as gains: there have been negative consequences in family breakdown, children's mental health, and the undervaluing of care. The costs fall disproportionately on the working poor and left-behind 'somewheres', and, for many, are starting to outweigh the benefits.

Going Home argues for a new social and policy settlement that supports gender equality, while also recognising the importance of stable families and community life.

David Goodhart is Head of Demography, Immigration & Integration at the think tank Policy Exchange. He is a former Director of Demos, and former Editor of *Prospect* magazine, which he founded in 1995. David is a prominent figure in public debate in the UK, as a well-known broadcaster, author, commentator, and journalist. His books include the bestselling *The Road to Somewhere* and *Head Hand Heart*.

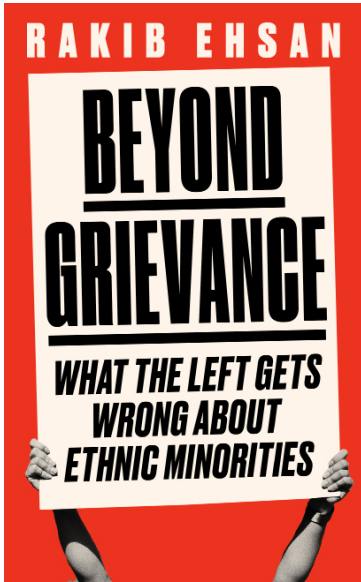
Enlightenment philosophers promised that sweeping away the old aristocracy and traditional institutions would liberate us. To some extent it did—but it also undermined the things that nourished ordinary people: family, marriage, religion and local community.

In *Regime Change*, Patrick Deneen examines the western tradition and argues that we must use the neglected resources of our philosophical heritage to construct a better way forward. Drawing on thinkers ranging from Aristotle and Machiavelli to Burke and Disraeli, Deneen develops a postliberal alternative. He proposes the formation of a new virtuous elite committed to working in alliance with an economically populist, cross-racial working class movement to promote the common good. This ‘aristopopulism’ can work to break up the unaccountable corporate concentrations of power while also restoring our civic institutions and protecting the family.

Patrick J. Deneen is Professor of Political Science and holds the David A. Potenziani Memorial College Chair of Constitutional Studies at the University of Notre Dame. He has previously taught at Princeton University and Georgetown University. His previous books include *Why Liberalism Failed*, *The Odyssey of Political Theory*, and *Democratic Faith*

Beyond Grievance highlights the growing tensions between the liberal cosmopolitanism which defines much of the British political Left, and the patriotic faith-based conservatism that runs deep in many of Britain's ethnic-minority communities. With American-style racial identity politics taking root in the UK, the book argues that many liberal-leftists are disregarding the attachments to the traditional triad of faith, family and flag in historically Labour-voting, ethnic-minority communities.

Rakib Ehsan argues that Britain needs a robust civic patriotism; an inclusive 'social-justice traditionalism' rooted in family, security and equality of opportunity.

Dr Rakib Ehsan is a research analyst and writer who specialises in matters of social cohesion, race relations and public security. His research has been published by think-tanks such as the Henry Jackson Society, Policy Exchange, ResPublica, and the Runnymede Trust. Rakib has written for publications including *The Telegraph*, the *Daily Mail*, and *UnHerd*. He was born in west London and raised in Luton by a strong, community-minded family of Bangladeshi origin and is a committed trade unionist.



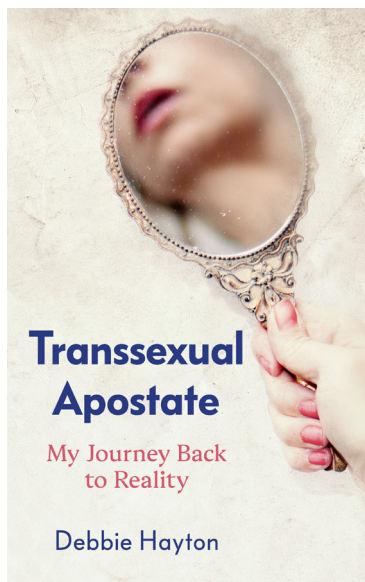

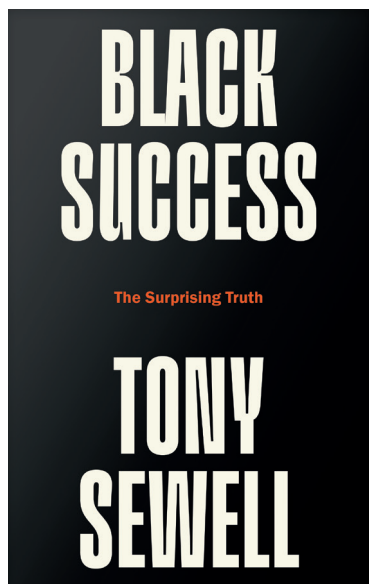
In a compelling first-hand account of what it means to be a transwoman — and where she feels the impulse comes from — Hayton explains why much of gender identity ideology is, in her view, false and damaging. She issues a compassionate call to move beyond ideological conflicts, and acknowledge the legitimate concerns that many people have with an agenda that asserts that transwomen are the same as women.

Hayton's honest, humane book shows that accepting reality will allow transwomen to live their best lives based on the truth of who they are, rather than the fantasy of who they are not.

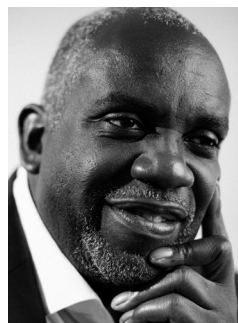

Truthful, provocative, and often surprising, Tony Sewell weaves together memoir and polemic to explore the drivers of black success in the UK. Drawing on real-life experiences, he traces these successes back to their source: family, education, hard work, discipline and the property market. He argues in favour of rejecting victimhood and embracing high ambitions, offering a more exciting, sometimes visionary new view of black life in Britain today.
