The grooming gangs scandal is the worst scandal in Britain this century.

Grooming Gangs is the first book about the scandal as a whole. It traces its origins in the second half of the twentieth century before its acceleration in the 1990s and beyond; its extent both in the number of victims and its geographical spread; and how the 'biraderi' or clan structure of the Pakistani community allowed it to flourish. It also shows the repeated attempts by parts of the state – from politicians to the police to social workers to teachers – to deny the scandal and to suppress attempts to expose it; and the smearing of those few brave social workers, journalists and politicians who did try to raise it as racists.

Reporter Charlie Peters has been following the story for the last ten years, and has broken countless scoops about it. Based on court transcripts as well as interviews with victims and those who worked with them, *Grooming Gangs* is the first book to tell the whole story of the scandal – a scandal that is yet to end.

Tracing the religious, political and historical motivations of both sides throughout many decades of turmoil and upheaval, *A Forever War* is the concise and non-partisan overview of the conflict that is so sorely needed.

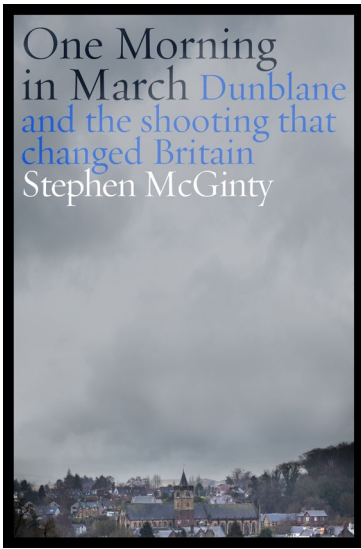

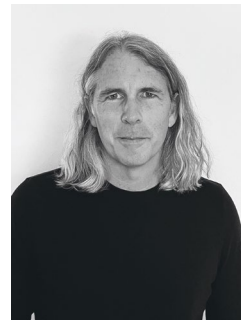

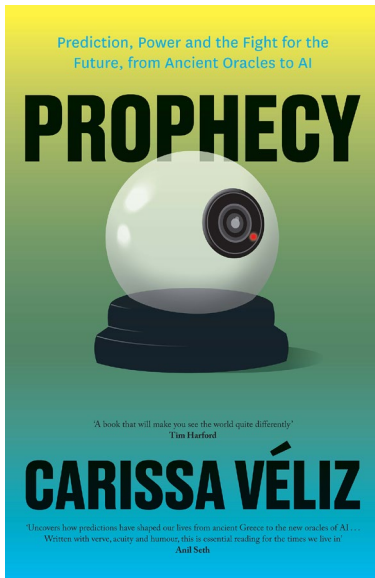
On 13 March 1996 a man walked into Dunblane Primary School armed with four legally owned handguns, and in less than four minutes fired 105 bullets, killing sixteen children and their Primary One teacher.

Based on original archival research, unseen royal correspondence and exclusive interviews with parents, *One Morning in March* tells – for the first time – of the lead-up to that day but also the incredible and powerful true story of how, in their darkest hour, a band of parents used their grief as fuel in a fight with John Major's Conservative government to forever ban handguns in Britain. 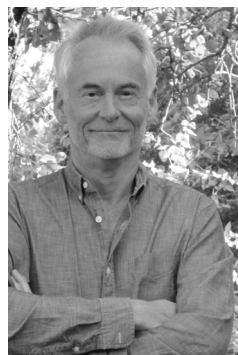

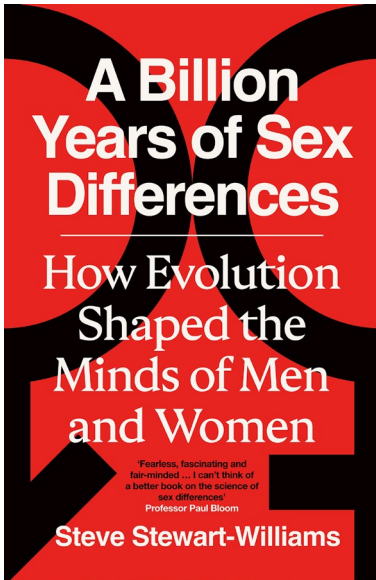

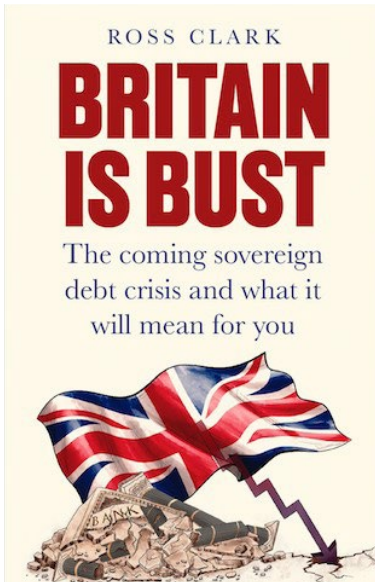

Britain is broke. We have been living beyond our means for decades, piling up debt year after year. It is now costing the British taxpayer well over £100 billion a year just to pay the interest on our borrowings – more than we spend on either education or defence. 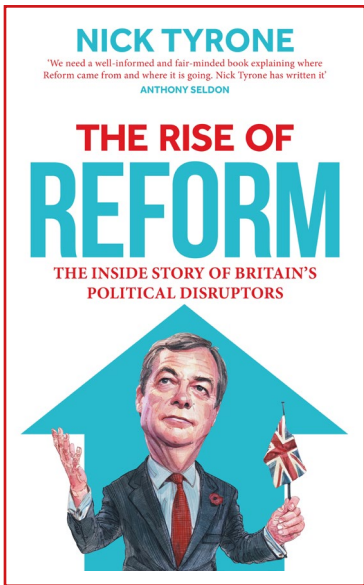
